

FACTs

- The Taro is a swollen river following extensive rainfall. It is, however, fordable at all points.
- The WEATHER is fair
- There is no TERRAIN blocking or hindering LINE OF SIGHT
- All slopes on the battlefield are gentle and pose no obstacle, nor provide any tactical advantage. The slopes to the French rear are steep.
- The time of the battle is unknown, but likely took place in the morning. TIME OF DAY is not relevant

VICTORY & DEFEAT

The Italians had trapped the French and cut off the latter's way home. However, the Italian art of war did not stimulate the total destruction of an enemy army. The French must force the Italian army in retreat, thus admitting defeat and the superiority of the French forces. Any other result is a total victory for the Italians, and will likely involve the French paying literally a King's ransom!
